SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

DISCUSSION POINTS	ACTIONS REQUIRED (By WHO&WHEN)
<p>Introduction</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brief introduction by the participants of the meeting. • CP sub cluster and PDMA welcomed all the participants of the meeting. • PDMA informed that Mr. Umar Farooq has taken the charge as Child Protection Coordinator in PDMA with the support of UNICEF. CP sub cluster welcomed Mr. Umar and believed that it will strengthen Govt./ PDMA especially in addressing CP issues and concerns. It will also strengthen coordination between humanitarian organizations and govt. 	
<p>Review of last meeting minutes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KhwendoKor(KK) and CP sub cluster informed MRE material not shared by SPADO. • PDMA shared that the issue of NOC from district line departments was discussed in GCM meeting in detail and decided that no NOC is required at the district level after getting one from PDMA. But IPs should consult with concerned line departments at provincial and district level before implementing their projects in districts. The line departments should be kept in loop and monthly progress reports should be shared regularly. • It was also shared by PDMA that separate meetings will be arranged with all clusters in the presence of line departments for giving a positive look to the interventions and monitoring purposes. • OCHA shared that after revision of HOP in July the total gap for all clusters of KP/ FATA decreased from US\$ 169 million to US\$ 95.3 million. No major changes in respect of gap for all clusters except food security (decreased from US\$ 65 million to US\$ 21 million) and CCCM (decreased from US\$27 to US\$16 million) and Shelter 	<p>KK and CP sub cluster will coordinate with SPADO to get MRE material.</p> <p>NOC to IPs for interventions at district level will be issued by PDMA.</p> <p>PDMA/CP Sub-cluster will share the GCM meeting minutes</p>

<p>cluster (with an increase of US\$ 26 million from US\$ 15 million).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Health cluster has revised its requirement from \$20.5 million to \$11.4 million. Gap has reduced from \$17.4 to \$7.7 million. • For other clusters, there have not been significant changes in outstanding funding requirements since the last revision. OCHA shared that HOP revision was endorsed on 17th Sept 2012 by HCT and it was also shared that donors now have the possibility to fund individual programs. • CP sub cluster suggested that cluster partners can use endorsed HOP projects for bilateral funding from donors. • IRC shared that TORs for district working group have been revised, Just GBV inputs are awaited. Once TORs finalized then it will be shared with the cluster. • It was shared that no minutes of meeting of DWGs received so far and district focal agencies are requested to share the minutes with cluster. • It was also shared that IOM focal person informed that funding for KP/ FATA is over so they are unable to further commit any information campaign. • PDMA will check the status on CP policy on safeguarding child protection in disasters and will update the cluster. IRC protection cluster co lead will also check the status with Ilona and update. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP sub cluster will check the status of funding from programs and will inform the cluster. • IRC will share the revised TORs with cluster before cluster meeting <p>HayatFatima Welfare Foundation and KK will share minutes of meeting of DWG in Dir Upper and D.I.Khan. Return monitoring agenda point will be added in the agenda of DWGs meeting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PDMA and IRC protection co-cluster lead will update the cluster on the status of CP policy on safeguarding child protection in disaster.
<p>IVAP presentation on Khyber IDPs specifically findings regarding CP issues:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IVAP shared that sample survey for Khyber IDPs living in host communities of Peshawar and Kurram agency is completed. Questions regarding concerns related to children were asked in this survey and IVAP is finalizing the survey report. Findings will be shared once report finalized. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presentation will be made by IVAP regarding sample survey in next cluster meeting

<p>Child Protection Rapid Assessment Tool:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP sub cluster shared that training was arranged by national CP sub cluster about Child Protection Rapid Assessment (CPRA) where participants were introduced to the whole process of CPRA, the tools and methodology that was drafted by global CP working group. So it was suggested that this CPRA tool can be tested on pilot basis for the IDPs of Khyber agency living in Jalozai and host community to know exactly about CP concerns which Khyber IDP children have. CP sub cluster briefed about the toolkit and methodology of CPRA. All the cluster members agreed to establish CPRA working group for KP/ FATA on initial basis. The CPRA Working Group was formed during the meeting. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organizations voluntarily presented for CPRA working group were KADO, SHID, PVDP, Hayat Foundation, Save the Children, IVAP, FARD, AHD and PDMA. • First meeting of CPRA working group will be held on 4th Oct 2012 to orient the members about the methodology of CPRA and discuss the way forward
<p>Presentation by Child Protection Commission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP commission, KP presented brief about CP commission, organizational structure of CP commission at provincial and district level, activities of CP commission at district level and development of CP Management Information System. • Cluster members expressed the need to establish regional offices in southern part of KP i-e LakkiMarwat, D.I.Khan, Tank, Karak as the nearest CP commission office established in district Kohat is very far from D.I.Khan, LakkiMarwat and Tank. • 	
<p>Updates, Issues, Challenges and gaps:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PVDP shared that with UNICEF support 3 PLaCES in New Durrani camp and 9 Child Protection Centres in district Hangu have been established for IDP children. 1,796 children and 218 women were registered in these centres till 15 Sept 2012. It was also shared that PVDP is supporting the returnees from New Durrani camp to Kurram agency by providing 2 volunteers with each returnee group who help the returnees if they face any problem especially to 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •

<p>children, address the issues and make the follow up.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social Welfare department shared that an assessment have been conducted to identify children without parental care, orphans, unattended and disabled children in district Dir Upper, Buner and Swat. Case management of each identified case have been made by social Welfare Department and these identified cases have been referred to service providers in these districts. It was also shared that after completion of this project, activities of the project will be clubbed with the CP commission established in Swat to take over the case management of identified cases. • Save the children shared that 12 new CFSs have been established in Peshawar valley for Khyber IDP children and 30 more CFSs will be established in future. 1,752 more children have been enrolled in these CFSs. 681 more children have been facilitated through 6 mobile CFSs. • Save the children also offered to provide support in form of funding to CP sub cluster for referral mechanism if needed. • 	
<p>AOB:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CP sub cluster informed that international day for girls child is being observed on 11th Oct 2012, to recognize girls' rights and the unique challenges girls face around the world. So CP sub cluster suggested that members of the CP Sub-cluster may also plan some activities to create awareness among the communities and 'Say No to Child Marriage'. So it was requested to kindly share their plans specifically for this day in their respective areas/districts or at provincial level and how we can communities and children be involved to raise their voices for ending the harmful practice of child marriage.
