Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and FATA
Week 29
Date: July 15- 21, 2012
1. Situation around IDP hosting districts
A: Situation in “Jalozai” IDP camp, Nowshera district

WHO along with health cluster partners and provincial health authorities lead the emergency health response for the displaced IDPs in Jalozai camp and IDPs living in host communities of district Nowshera.

Population:

Till 20th July, 2012 total IDPs families registered are 73,552 families with 339, 357 individuals. Jalozai IDP camp hosts 13, 406 families with 63, 803 individuals. 60, 146 families with 275,554 individuals are living in off communities.

Alerts and Consultations:

Two alerts were reported one for Malaria and one for Measles. There were 4,345 consultations provided through health care providers, including acute respiratory infection (15.2% or 662 cases), acute diarrhoea (7.2% or 315 cases), skin infection (4% or 162 cases) and suspected malaria (2% or 70 cases).

Coordination:

Health & WASH cluster meetings take place once a week in Jalozai attended by partners from health (Merlin, CAMP, CERD, FATA Health, GiZ, AGE, IR, CTC, UNICEF), WASH, Nutrition, Food and CCM clusters working in the camp where issues are discussed and decisions are taken on the spot to address any loop holes in the health response for containment and control of disease outbreaks in the camp.

The Thirty third camp health cluster coordination meeting of Jalozai was held on Friday July 18th, 2012, at J-3 health post of Merlin. The meeting was chaired by WHO. UNFPA, Merlin, CAMP, CERD, HRDS, SSD, CTC (UNICEF), HelpAge International, World vision and DoH representatives attended the meeting.

HelpAge International Pakistan has planned Advocacy workshops- with all stakeholders including National, International organization, Government and UN agencies for addressing older people’s relief and recovery needs through their interventions. 50 staff of partners and DoH will be trained on PHC age friendly and eye care.

It was decided by the forum that UNFPA will take a lead to form a sub cluster including world vision, HelpAge, CAMP, Khwendo Kor (KK) and any other organization having psychologist to coordinate their activities as asked by CCM. WHO will help UNFPA as and when needed.

EHE Interventions:

WHO carried out 1 day training of social mobilizers/ health promoters of CERD on WHO Health Promotion guidelines. 23 participants from CERD were trained on WHO Health Promotion Guidelines. This training was part of WHO health promotion plan for KPK.

WHO carried out 2 days training workshop on “Water Quality Improvement & Hygiene Promotion”. 40 participants

were trained.

WHO provided 300 sets of IEC material to WASH partner “Lasoona” in the camp on Health & Hygiene so that they can further disseminate it in the community through proper counseling and sensitization.

WHO tested 12 water samples for residual chlorine both at sources and at user ends, 9 samples were found to have residual chlorine within the required limits while for the rest of the samples chlorine dose was adjusted.

WHO has so far tested 855 water samples for residual chlorine, out of which more than 90% of samples have shown residual chlorine and for the rest chlorine dose was adjusted accordingly.

WHO tested 4 samples for microbiological contamination and all samples were found fit for drinking with no contamination.

WHO has so far tested 185 samples for microbiological contamination, out of which less than 1 % of samples showed contamination at consumers’ end probably due to improper handling, for which chlorine dose was adjusted and health and hygiene messages provided.

Essential Medicines:

WHO visited CAMP Organization's health facility # 1 and J-3 supported by Merlin. EM situation was monitored and found that all key essential medicines are present in sufficient amount. Overall conditions of RUM, Pharmaceutical storage and patient counselling found satisfactory. WHO delivered 9 types of assorted essential medicines to Merlin which is sufficient for 2887 patients approximately.

B. Togh Sarai” IDP camp, Hangu district

The security situation of all on & off camp areas of district Hangu was very volatile. WHO paid short visits to the camp. Police (Special Branch) officer informed WHO to keep very limited movement in the district.

CERD working in Togh Sarai IDP camp requested WHO for some medicines. The official request has been forwarded to the pharmacy department for approval. Total of 1159 families with 5821 individuals are residing in the camp. CERD and WHO providing health care services to the IDPs.

WHO provided 6,000 anti bacterial soap to RID (WASH partner) for proper distribution among camp IDPs for hand washing and for prevention of skin diseases.

C. Situation in Tank district

WHO conducted AWD training for the In charges of health facilities in district. WHO coordinated with DoH staff at BHU Shorkot and BHU Zaffarabad for preparations of AWD prevention as there were rains few days before and were chances of AWD outbreaks. WHO emphasized distribution of aqua tabs in the community. WHO collected 6 water samples from BHU Zaffarabad and BHU Shorkot, 3 from each BHU. All samples contained minor biological contamination. EHE provided 10,000 aqua tabs to each health facility and suggested to boil water if possible.

WHO conducted monitoring visits to BHU Kirri Haider, Daud Khel and Chesan Kuch where medicine stock was evaluated in context of AWD, fluid stock in these facilities was found deficient and reported to DEDO H. WHO monitored 14 health facilities for monitoring and evaluation of the routine as well as Polio specific activities.

WHO conducted daily meetings with EDO H for discussion on the campaign progress and identification of problems. WHO held daily evening meetings to discuss the daily progress of NID campaign. The meetings were held at the DCO compound. WHO conducted meeting with the EPI coordinator to discuss the market survey result so that special teams can be deputed at the poor areas. WHO held discussion with district surgeon in order to verify diagnosis for cases of Leishmaniasis.

D. Situation in D I Khan district

26 reports were received by WHO through e DEWS. WHO conducted visits to high risk union councils for AWD during NID s from 16th July 2012 to 19th July 2012.

IDPs (SWA) SITUATION & RETURN: 27,569 families of IDPs of SWA are living in D I KHAN. 460 families have returned in June 2012. Repatriation of IDPs of SWA has started on 16th July 2012. Emergency Health cover was provided by Pak Army & DoH to the IDPs during return process. Off camp active population is based on WFP's food distribution data consolidated with UNHCR's Registration Data. In addition to displaced IDP's, WFP also assisted 6,099 IDP families in return areas.

UNFPA has got extension in its project. It was providing EMOC services in two Tehsils, Paroa & Pahar Pur. PRCS will continue its PHC services at CD Nai Wela. MdM-F will close its project from 31st July 2012. It is running two health facilities i.e. BHU Daraban Khurd and BHU Ramak in Tehsil Paroa.

WHO participated in daily evening meetings in DCO office from 16th July 2012 to 19th July 2012. The meetings were chaired by DCO himself and attended by EDO Health, Deputy EDO Health, EPI Coordinator, WHO, Tehsil Monitors, Area Supervisors and DHTs. WHO shared its observations and feedback of the monitoring visits on Polio days with the participants of the meeting. WHO performed market survey for Polio immunization coverage on Friday, 20th July 2012. The findings of the survey were shared with the Regional Coordinator PEI WHO and EPI Coordinator.

E. New Durrani" IDP camp, Kurram Agency

FATA Disaster Management Authority has issued NOC to Save and Serve organization. Save and Serve are providing Primary health care services in New Durrani IDP camp. WHO provided training to the staff of Save and Serve on concepts of DEWS, essential medicines and its rational use, request procedures and consumption protocols there by stressing rational use of essential medicines.

F. Situation in Kohat district

WHO monitored polio activities in the district on 16th, 17th, 18th and 19th of July at different areas.

WHO received and responded measles cases reported from LMH Hospital. Newly appointed EPI coordinator has refused to respond to any alert identified by WHO.

WHO provided 15,000 anti bacterial soap units to store keeper of EDO-Health Kohat for affective use in any emergency situation during summer season. WHO provided 05 mob buckets along with brooms and wipers to CH Shakardara, RHC Bilitang, RHC Lachi and RHC Chorlaki. WHO provided 50,000 aqua tabs to store keeper of EDO-Health Kohat for proper distribution and use among the communities. WHO provided 2400 pure sachets to RHC Lachi

25 out of 43 health facilities in district Kohat provided eDEWS data.

Due to voltage fluctuation in electricity of WHO built warehouse in the District, Air Conditioners installed in the warehouse are not working properly and need stabilizers. There are total 6 AC's (2Tons).

eDEWS:

KPK eDEWS:

- 343 reports were received reporting 110,538 patient consultations in 14 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Province. Acute respiratory infections are the highest cause of morbidity (14.2% or 15,713 cases) showing 3% decrease in percentage; acute diarrhoea (12% or 12,840 cases); skin infection (2.1% or 2,357 cases); suspected malaria (2% or 1,721 cases).

FATA eDEWS:

- 36 reports were received reporting 13,923 patient consultations in 2 agencies of FATA. Acute respiratory infections are the highest cause of morbidity (10.5% or 1,462 cases) showing 1% decrease; acute diarrhoea (9.1% or 1,265 cases); skin infection (1.4% or 189 cases); suspected malaria (9% or 1,213 cases).

Alerts:

- WHO received and responded to a total of 70 alerts including 7 outbreaks. 52 alerts were for suspected measles, 1 for AVH, 1 for Enteric Fever, 1 for AD, 4 for AWD, 1 for Malaria, 1 for NNT, 1 for Pertusis, 1 for viral Encephalitis and 7 for Leishmaniasis. All cases reported were properly investigated and responded by WHO team.

DTCs:

- WHO support EHSAR Foundation for running DTC center in Pabbi satellite hospital district Nowshera. In last week 2012 a total of 190 patients consulted at DTC center in District Nowshera, out of these 113 were of type A, 57 were of type B and 20 were of type C. All were provided appropriate treatment following standard protocols.

Essential Medicines:

- WHO conducted 21 monitoring visits in district Mardan, D.I. Khan, Tank, Dir Lower, Kohat and Swat. During monitoring visits gaps regarding irrational use, storage of essential medicines, record keeping, safe disposal of expired drugs and stock outs identified generally. WHO provided hands on trainings to the concerned staff of health facilities.
- WHO conducted one day training on rational use of medicines and STG on AWD held at DTC Pabbi, Nowshera to the staff of EHSAR Foundation in which 12 participants including 3 MOs, 1 FMO, 5 nurses, 2 pharmacists and an H.P.M.
- WHO responded 3 Measles alerts at D.I. Khan by providing Vitamin A.
- WHO provided 3 types of assorted medicines to Bannu which are sufficient for 1600 patients.
- WHO arranged training for Save & Serve staff that will be providing PHC services at New Durrani's IDPs camp Kurram agency. 8 staff members trained on concept of essential medicines, request procedures and consumption protocols thereby stressing rational use of essential medicines.
- WHO conducted visits to DDHS FATA and FATA main warehouse in regards to provision of essential medicines support to returning IDPS of SW and New Durrani camp Kurram agency. DDHS has been requested to provide list of H.Fs covering return areas in SW.
- WHO provided 2 EHKs which is sufficient to cover 12000 population to Save & Serve working at New Durrani IDPS camp Kurram agency.
- 1000 Oxytocin injections received at DHS FATA main warehouses thereby making the supply of 5 IEHKs to DHS FATA complete

WASH:

- **District Peshawar:**
- WHO conducted two days training on "water quality improvement and hygiene promotion" The training was held in Peshawar on 17th and 18th July 2012. Water supply managers from Public Health Engineering Department Afghan refugee's camps hosting districts participated in the training.
- WASH Cluster meeting was held at local government secretariat Peshawar on 17th July 2012. Issues related to

Bara IDPs and flood contingency planning was discussed. WHO was nominated member for technical working groups on water supply, sanitation and hygiene promotion.

• **District Charsadda:**

- WHO upon request of TMA Swabi provided one day on job training on 19th July, 2012 to PHED field staff on water quality testing for critical parameters using Wagtech portable water testing kit recently donated by WHO. Four staff members from TMA Chota Lahore and TMA Swabi participated in this activity.
- WHO district Swabi received EH supplies including Aqua tabs 100000, pure sachet 60000, Hygiene kits 100 and collapsible Jerry cans from Peshawar office for support of DoH in diarrhoea prevention and control measures in the district.
- WHO visited district water testing lab established by WHO after 2010 floods. TMA staff is waiting for formal training, installation and calibration of the lab equipment to run water quality tests.
- WHO conducted a follow up visit of the HCWM training to BHU Utmanzai, BHU Munda Tehsil Tangi on 20th July, 2012. The staff was advised to ensure proper waste segregation and land filling within the available premises following WHO SOPs shared in the recently conducted training.
- WHO is collaborating with TMA Tangi regarding water quality control in flood prone areas of Tehsil Tangi (Village Abazai and ZiaratKalay). TMA will provide water samples for analysis and joint alert investigation and response during diarrhoea season.
- WHO visited THQ Tangi. The hospital needs urgent assistance of chemical disinfectant and sanitary equipment. WHO team provided 500 soap units, 50 hygiene kits 10000 aqua tabs and 50 sets of IEC material in children wards and for diarrhoea patients.
- WHO provided on job training of the sanitary staff of THQ Tangi is planned next week requested by the hospital management for improvement of hygiene condition of the hospital.

• **District Mardan:**

- WHO conducted meeting with EDO Health, Deputy EDO Health, and EPI Coordinator Mardan. EPI Coordinator briefed about the activities of current NID with forum and also requested all members for active participation in monitoring of NIDs' activities.
- WHO conducted routine monitoring visits to DHQ Mardan, Mardan Medical Complex, RHC Sherghar, CH Lund Khwar, TDH Katlang, BHU SawalDher and BHU Jamal Ghari. During visits on job training of health staff was conducted. Water samples were collected from RHC Sherghar, CH Lundkhwar, BHU SawalDher and BHU Jamal Ghari for bacteriological tests; all results reveal water safe for drinking. 576 antiseptic soaps, 58 Hand rub sanitizers, 2000 Aquatabs, 1440 Pure sachets and 35 IEC materials of different subject were displayed and provided to DHQ Mardan, RHC Sherghar, CH Lund Khwar and TDH Katlang during monitoring visits.

• **District Shangla:**

- WHO conducted meeting with EDO health Shangla regarding the provision of WASH items to different health facilities. CRS is going to start water quality monitoring of the newly completed water supply schemes with the support of WHO in the district.
- In routine water quality monitoring WHO collected and tested 07 water samples from different areas in Tehsil Besham. Out of which 02 samples from springs in village Lahore and Kormong were found unfit for drinking. WHO distributed 3000 Aqua tabs, 300 soaps and 50 IEC materials in the community.

• **District Swat:**

- WHO conducted response to alert of acute diarrhoea from BHU Islampur in which 220 cases of acute diarrhoea were reported. Total of 6000 Water Purified Sachet, 20000 Aqua Tabs and 50 Hygiene Kits were provided to BHU Islampur with IEC Material for affected Community for further distribution. Health Education sessions were also conducted with the community regarding the importance of Hygiene, safe drinking water and use of aqua tabs. PPHI and DoH informed about the situation.

• **District Haripur:**

- WHO received and responded suspected AWD alert at Jantri District Abbotabad. Total 3 water samples were collected for bacteriological analyses during alert investigation, 100 % tested water samples were found with bacteriological contamination.
- Besides dug well disinfection, WHO provided 10 hygiene kits, 100 antiseptic soaps, 1000 Aqua tabs, 1200 Pure sachets and 80 IEC materials of different subject were displayed and provided to community during AWD response. 5 Kg HTH was handed over to community for further chlorination after on job chlorination

training. The community and in specific the affected families were educated for the improvement of their hygiene i.e. use of chlorinated water for drinking purpose.

- **District Dir:**

- WHO Conducted meeting with MS Dir upper, EDOH Dir upper, MS, EDO health Dir upper regarding moonson contingency and preparedness plan.

- Five water samples were taken from DHQ Dir upper private ward, casualty, dental ward, children ward and hostel. All the samples were highly contaminated. WHO provided HTH to the hospital for water disinfection at source.

- **FATA:**

- WHO conducted meeting with MS AHQ Ghalanai, regarding the monsoon contingency plan and distribution of the supplies. 3000 Jerry cans delivered to Mohmand, Bajour and Khyber agency as part of contingency stock for AWD out breaks response.

Nutrition:

- WHO conducted meeting with FATA directorate personnel regarding the operationalization of the NSC in Agency Head Quarter, Ghallanai, Mohmand Agency. Another meeting is planned in the next week to deliberate more on the matter.

- WHO conducted monitoring visit to Nowshera NSC. Issues discussed with incharge Pediatrician.

- WHO conducted monitoring visit to Nowshera Sentinel sites, Akbar Pura and Akora Khattak. WHO provided Nutritional equipments to the facilities.

- WHO participated in Nutrition cluster meeting for KPK/FATA at DG Health office Peshawar.

- **Upper Dir:** WHO conducted monitoring and supervisory visits to the Stabilization centre. WHO participated in district Inauguration of the Polio Eradication Campaign. WHO held meeting with the Executive District Officer Health and Medical Superintendent District Head Quarter Hospital (DHQ) Upper Dir regarding incentives payment to stabilization centre staff.

- **Lower Dir:** WHO conducted visit to National Programme for FPPHC at Tamergarah and held meeting with respective focal person to ensure timely data collection from LHWs of Sentinel Sites at Lower Dir.

- WHO performed visit to NSC Chakdara for monitoring and support for NSC admitted patients.

- WHO conducted visit to RHC Gukabad for distributing HANSS data formats and collection of Nutrition Surveillance data during July 1-10, 2012.

- WHO visited EDO-H Office current updates on Nutrition Programme was shared with EDO-H and also meeting was conducted with DNC, DOH and updates were shared.

- WHO conducted monitoring/supervisory visit to THQ-H Chakdara to support Inpatient services at NSC Chakdara and to compile data of SC admitted/discharged patients for weekly report compilation.

- WHO visited office of National Programme for FPPHC at Tamergarah, Lower Dir on request of National Programme focal person, for suggestions regarding arranging Nutrition (CMAM) Training for LHWs/LHSs of District Lower Dir. On request of District Nutrition Coordinator, WHO visited EDO-H Office Tamergarah to participate in a quarterly review meeting of ongoing CMAM programme at district level.

- **Kohistan:** WHO conducted coordination meeting with EDO (H) and DCO for the provision of space for NSC in RHC Pattan to Malteser International.

District level coordination & monitoring:

Shangla: WHO monitored NID throughout the district. WHO conducted meeting with the community members of village Pagorai regarding the water supply scheme recently approved by District government after 03 days of survey of the area by WHO. It was decided in the meeting that civil work will be supervised by the community and will also provide human resource. WHO held meeting with district administration regarding wajeaha Thalassemia centre funds provision. WHO conducted meeting with EDOH on EPI technician hiring provision by the provincial government after one time approval for 1yr certificate holders. WHO visited CH Chakesar, BHU Katkoo, BHU Towa, CD kotkay, RHC Karora, THQ Besham, CD Shang, BHU Maira, CD Ielonai, BHU Shalizara.. WHO received and responded total of 04 alerts (02 Cutaneous Leishmaniasis, Pertusis and Enteric fever).

Haripur: WHO received and responded 9 alerts. WHO attended evening NID meetings chaired by DCO. WHO visited 9 health facilities (DHQ, CD KTS3, RHC Khanpur, BHU Sarai Saleh, BHU Shah Muhammad, BHU STC4, BHU Tofkian, BHU Mang, BHU Khoi Nara). ARI 19% with increase of 1% compared to previous week remained the major cause of morbidity both in Hosting and Afghan refugee population in Haripur followed by diarrhoea 9% with 0% decrease compared to previous week and scabies 2% with no change in its proportional morbidity.

Mardan: WHO conducted meeting with EDO Health, Deputy EDO Health, and EPI Coordinator Mardan. EPI Coordinator briefed about the activities of current NID with forum and also requested all members for active participation in monitoring of NIDs' activities. EDO Health shared that they have 35000 ORS balance at their district store for the health facilities of district Mardan, he also requested WHO to prepare distribution plan and also for support in distribution of ORS to the health facility according to plan. WHO prepared plan for ORS distribution and shared with EDO Health office. WHO conducted routine monitoring visits to DHQ Mardan, Mardan Medical Complex, RHC Sherghar, CH Lund Khowar, TDH Katlang, BHU Sawal Dher and BHU Jamal Ghari. During visits WHO conducted on job training of health staff on disease case definition, alert/outbreaks response and weekly eDEWS reporting. WHO actively participated in NIDs activities. Market Survey was also conducted by WHO at MMC and DHQ Hospital Mardan on 20th July 2012 and survey report was shared with concerned offices. WHO received and responded 6 alerts (4 Suspected Measles alerts with 1 outbreak and 2 C-Leishmaniasis), all the reported alerts were responded jointly with DoH and PPHI, during response all the required interventions were carried out.

Lower Dir & Upper: WHO conducted coordination meeting with MS Dir upper, EDOH Dir upper, MS, EDO health Dir upper. WHO team visited DHQ Dir upper and lower, BHU Osakia, CD Munjai.

Swat: WHO received and responded 5 alerts of suspected Measles. WHO responded ten system generated alerts of Week 28 in the current week. WHO fully participated in the NID from 16th to 19th July 2012, participation was ensured in the evening meetings chaired by DCO Swat and daily progress was shared with the forum. WHO conducted coordination meetings with the EDO Health Swat and EPI Coordinator Swat. WHO conducted monitoring visit to BHU Miandam, BHU Kotanai, BHU Islampur and BHU Fatehpur. WHO conducted response to alert of Acute Diarrhea from BHU Islampur in which the reported 220 cases of acute diarrhoea, visit was made to the health facility for two consecutive days and Aqua tabs, hygiene kits and soaps were distributed in the community. Health education session was also conducted with the community regarding the importance of Hygiene, safe drinking water and use of aqua tabs. PPHI and DoH informed about the situation.

Charsadda: WHO visited BHU Rajjar, BHU Utmanzai, BHU Turangzai, BHU Umerzai, DHQ hospital, THQ Tangi, BHU M.Nari. Registers checked and on job orientation of the facility incharges regarding eDEWS was done. DEWS data was submitted by 47 health facilities. WHO received and responded 4 measles alerts. Total consultations recorded are 13654. URTI is 14%, OAD 10%, Malaria 3%, scabies 4%. WHO participated in polio campaign started on 16th July and ended on 18th of July. During campaign teams were supervised, fix centres were checked and house hold clusters were taken.

Manshera: WHO received and responded two alerts for suspected Measles, one alert from Arbora Oghi turned out to be an outbreak of Measles. WHO participated in NIDs from 16 – 20 July, 2012 during campaign 10 fixed sites, 6 area Incharges, 5 transit teams, and 7 mobile teams monitored. 6 clusters taken and Market survey conducted in Main Bazar of Manshera (121 Children assessed for finger marking). WHO attended daily evening meetings with DHTs and DCO during NIDs and feedback of field activities given WHO conducted visit to DHQ Hospital, BHU Sandesar, BHU Shohal, BHU Bherkund, BHU Arbora, CD Khaki, RHC Chowki and THQ Balakot for DEWS strengthening and NID monitoring.

Khyber Agency: WHO received and responded one Measles outbreak. In response to outbreak, three days surveillance visit was done and a total of 22 suspected cases including 4 deaths were identified. WHO vaccinated a total of 480 children during mass measles campaign. WHO responded 4 system generated alerts all of these were false alerts. WHO participated in NID Polio Inauguration and actively participated in the campaign. WHO

conducted coordination meetings with Agency Surgeon, FSMO and PPHI. WHO conducted monitoring visits to BHU Ali Masjid, CD Qadam, BHU Mian Morcha.

Mohmand Agency: WHO conducted monitoring visits to 6 health facilities AHQ Ghalanai, RHC Yakaghund, BHU Michni, BHU Ghazi kor, BHU Kasai & BHU Baro khel. WHO actively participated in Polio NID. WHO conducted coordination meeting with MS AHQ Ghalanai regarding contingency plan for current diarrhoea season. WHO conducted coordination meeting with Agency Surgeon & project manager ACD regarding selection of Malaria diagnostic centers under GFATM R-10. WHO received 2000 jerry canes & 70000 Aqua tabs for contingency. WHO conducted on job training to BHU Baro khel staff on alert & outbreak reporting & response.

Bajaur Agency: WHO actively participated in NIDs which held on 16th to 19th July, 2012 in terms of monitoring different health facilities and different parts of the agency at community level especially for verifying work of Polio teams through clusters assessment. On 20th June, 2012 WHO carried out market survey along with PEO & AHCSO of Bajaur Agency. 21 out of 24 sentinel sites submitted their eDEWS data. WHO received and responded to 5 alerts of Measles this week. WHO visited and monitored 5 health facilities, feedback shared with Agency Surgeon and EPI Coordinator. WHO conducted coordination meeting with MS-AHQ hospital of Bajaur Agency regarding details of work done by WHO engineers in the renovation of labor room. Engineers have handed over the building to MS and routine activities of labor room are resumed.

Lakki Marwat & Bannu: WHO participated in July NID (polio eradication campaign) activities in district Bannu and Lakki Marwat. WHO team supervised and monitored campaign activities in five different UC's of both districts. Data shared with concerned authorities in evening meetings. WHO conducted coordination meeting with MS city hospital and EDO health Lakki Marwat regarding safe disposal of hospital waste. WHO conducted coordination meeting with EDO health and EPI coordinator of district Bannu to discuss about shortage of measles vaccine in the district and to improve the outreach activities. WHO monitored 9 health facilities. Five health facilities were visited in district Lakki Marwat and four in Bannu. WHO briefed health staff about DEWS, case definitions, weekly report submission and safe waste disposal management during these visits. WHO received and responded 3 alerts. One each of NNT and Measles was reported from district Lakki Marwat and one alert of suspected Viral Encephalitis was reported from district Bannu.
