<p><b>Review of action points from the previous meeting</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PDMA informed that Education department KP is interested to have a separate meeting between PDMA, FDMA, KP &amp; FATA Education Department and Education cluster to resolve the issues of attendance in the cluster meetings, IDP children enrolment in govt. schools and NOC.</li> <li>• IRC shared the assessment findings of Protection unit of IRC conducted in Jalozai in June 2012.</li> <li>• As Save the Children was not present in meeting, so response on assessment conducted in Peshawar valley by SC could not be made.</li> <li>• PDMA shared that a letter to KP education department to know the exact number of IDP children enrolled in govt. schools will be issued.</li> <li>• Education cluster informed that number of Helpline of Child Protection sub cluster have been shared with cluster partners to record the issues being faced by IDP children in admission in govt. institutes.</li> <li>• EGRA assessment findings have been shared by IRC.</li> <li>• UNICEF has shared the questionnaire of school census of KP/ FATA with UNESCO.</li> <li>• UNICEF has shared the damage assessment findings with cluster to circulate within cluster partners.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PDMA will coordinate to arrange a meeting and will invite KP &amp; FATA education departments, FDMA and Education cluster in the office of PDMA or Education department.</li> <li>• IRC will share the soft copy of the finding with cluster for further dissemination.</li> <li>• CHEF international will share the assessment findings of Nowshehra and Peshawar with cluster.</li> <li>• Education cluster will again communicate with NRC to attend the meetings and UNICEF Education section will share the email of relevant person for invitation.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Updated situation by PDMA/ FDMA (after recent rains):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PDMA shared that recent rains/ flooding had badly affected phase 7 &amp; 8 in Jalozai camp causing damages to tents, food</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PDMA will share report of assessment of Nowshehra district with cluster with in week.</li> </ul>

<p>ration and NFIs. Survey of damages has been completed in phase 7 &amp; 8 and for other phases it will be started within few days. PDMA in coordination with WFP and UNHCR is providing food ration to affected IDPs and replaced damaged tents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• PDMA shared that Nowshehra district was also hit due to heavy rains/ flash flooding and caused damages to 250 – 300 houses but the situation is under control The survey is under way and will be shared once completed. There is coordination of PDMA with DCO Nowshehra and food and tents were provided to DCO for immediate relief needed.</li> <li>• IRC shared the findings of damage assessment to IRC managed camp schools in Jalozai due to recent heavy rains conducted by their staff detail of damages. The report of assessment already shared with cluster.</li> <li>• IRC requested PDMA to reconstruct the damaged infrastructure outside four camp schools in Jalozai. PDMA agreed to do the needful.</li> <li>• FDMA shared that situation is due to recent rains in FATA is normal.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IRC and PDMA focal persons in Jalozai will coordinate to reconstruct the infrastructure in Jalozai camp school if possible.</li> <li>• FDMA will share the contact detail of their focal person in Jalozai Camp for coordination.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Stationary requirement by partners in Jalozai:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education informed the forum that NDMA at national level has offered some school supplies including school bags and stationary items to National education cluster for distribution to IDP children of Jalozai affected due to recent rains. So if any organization working in Jalozai can request education cluster to get these school supplies to distribute in IDP children enrolled in camp schools of Jalozai.</li> <li>• IRC showed their interest to get these school supplies.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IRC will request education cluster by sharing their distribution plan with education cluster to get the school supplies of NDMA and supplies will be used in two affected schools.</li> <li>• Cluster coordinator will coordinate with national cluster for provision of school supplies.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Schools under attack:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education cluster stressed the need to have the schools statistics which have been damaged by militancy in KP and FATA. It was shared that a database of damaged schools due to militancy have to be developed by education cluster KP/ FATA and response made in these schools made by various agencies including govt., Pak army, UNICEF and other INGOs in these schools.</li> <li>• FDMA requested the forum that organizations working on educational response in FATA have to share their interventions detail with FDMA, so that FDMA will be in loop and have the record of educational interventions.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education cluster will discuss the need of schools under attack statistics in the meeting with KP/ FATA education department.</li> <li>• PDMA and FDMA will also coordinate with education departments of KP and FATA to get this data.</li> <li>• Organizations working on educational response in FATA will have to share the detail of their interventions with FDMA.</li> <li>• IMO will coordinate with SPADO for getting the information regarding the school under attack.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Assessment Performa:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The forum discussed the planned assessment activity in Jalozai camp to find out exact number of under 18 children as there is a discrepancy in IRC Protection unit's assessment and statistics of PDMA/ UNCHR about children population in Jalozai (The number of children have been got by formula from PDMA/ UNHCR IDP population updates).</li> <li>• IRC shared the forum assessment findings conducted by IRC Protection unit in Jalozai in June 2012. IRC also shared the questionnaire which was used for the said assessment.</li> <li>• Education cluster shared that few responses from education cluster members have been received and the tool for assessment have been finalized.</li> <li>• IVAP shared the assessment in 20 UCs of town 3 &amp; 4 of Peshawar have been completed.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education cluster will have a meeting of education member organizations working in Jalozai to finalize the plan of assessment in School # 4 of Phase # 6 in Jalozai on 10<sup>th</sup> Sept 2012 at 10:00 am.</li> <li>• Finalized tool will be shared by Education cluster with cluster members.</li> <li>• IRC, Muslim Aid, IVAP, CERD, HRDS will participate in a meeting along with cluster.</li> <li>• IVAP will share the assessment findings conducted with IDP population in the Peshawar valley</li> </ul>
<p><b>Presentation on EGRA and EGRA findings by IRC:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IRC will share the soft copy of the finding with cluster</li> </ul>

<p><b>AOB:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NOC from district authorities have been raised again and it was decided to highlight and address this issue in the meeting with education departments of KP &amp; FATA.</li> <li>• Cluster members were invited to send the nominations for fourth session of INEE training, which is planned in next month if number of confirm nominations reached to 30 at least. After confirmation of 30 participants, the 4<sup>th</sup> Session of INEE will be conducted in the last week of Sep. 2012.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• An email will be sent by the cluster coordinator to get the nomination for INEE. Interested cluster members will send the nominations for fourth session of INEE capacity building workshop before 13<sup>th</sup> Sep.2012.</li> <li>• PDMA will share 10 nominations of PDMA staff and DDMOs which was already committed to participate in fourth session of INEE training workshop.</li> <li>• IRC will share the focal person from national education foundation, Peshawar to invite in the meeting of education cluster.</li> </ul>
