## Highlights

### Monsoon 2013 Contingency Planning :

- Education cluster has prepared contingency planning for monsoon 2013 available on education cluster Pak at <http://pak.humanitarianresponse.info/document/education-cluster-contingency-planning-2013>
- UNICEF has developed Meena story having important messages about flood preparedness.

### Monsoon 2012 Response updates :

- Rehabilitation work completed in 32 girls schools in Balochistan with Emergency Response Fund (ERF) support . Funding gap for the cluster response remains at 80% against a total requirement of US\$7.1 million

### Education Cluster Response for displacement in KP/FATA :

- 41 camp schools including 8 ECE centers are functional in Jalozei, Togh Sarai and New Durrani IDP camps with total enrollment of 10,623 children (5,055 girls and 5,668 boys). Only 18 % of \$ 8.7 million is received during 2013

## Updates on Monsoon 2013 Contingency Planning

**Monsoon 2013 Updates :** Per OCHA Situation report (15th June 2013), heavy early monsoon rains are being experienced across the country. High Flood Levels being reported in river Kabul at Nowshera (includes River Swat at this point) with 160,000 cusecs approx. discharge (media reports) on 14 / 15 June.

Lahore has received above 80 mm overnight rains recently. Urban flooding tends to occur during monsoons causing heavy losses;

**Education cluster contingency planning 2013 :** Education cluster has prepared contingency planning for monsoon 2013

- National and subnational meetings are being held to review cluster preparedness planed by end of June 2013.
- Capacity mapping tool on human and material resources and stock piling is being updated .

- Current stock of emergency supplies available with cluster members is not sufficient to cater to the needs of any potential emergency. The major supply items required upon onset of an emergency include School-in-a-Box (SIB) kits, school tents, Recreation Kits, ECD Kit, Blackboards, Seating mats, Water cooler, Tarpaulin rolls, Schoolbags etc; So far, 12 cluster members have shared supplies information which can cover need of only 8,000 children. Meanwhile, UNICEF is planning to preposition additional education supplies for 1200 children.
- UNICEF has processed contingency project cooperation agreements in Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan and KPK to address any future emergency needs.

### **Capacity Building on Information Management:**

UN OCHA in collaboration of Education cluster KP/ FATA has conducted capacity building workshop on information management for **Information Management (IM)** focal persons of Education and Child Protection sub cluster members on June 10, 2013.

## Monsoon 2012 Response

### ERF Projects in Sindh Balochistan and Sindh

#### Balochistan :

Balochistan Boys Scouts Association (BBSA) completed refurbishment work in 31 girls schools, while work is in progress in 6 schools. The refurbishment work includes provision of water and sanitation facilities AND repair of school buildings such as roof, wall, floor, window, doors, electrification & white wash of the damaged schools

43 PTSMCs are activated /formed and trained on the role and responsibilities of PTSMCs including school safety and DRR, PTSMC members are taken onboard for refurbishment in planning and monitoring of schools. In total 225 PTSMC members are orientated including 181 women and 44 men.

**Emergency Response Fund**- UNOCHA and Education Cluster carried out a joint monitoring mission to Jaffarabad district in Balochistan province during

June 3-6, 2013. The mission was led by Program Officer -ERF and supported by provincial Education Cluster.

The mission visited 8 schools currently refurbished by Balochistan Boys Scouts Association and assessed the mid-term project progress and outputs.

Jaffarabad has been affected by the recurrent floods during 2010 and 2012 damaging school's infrastructure. This project has been envisaged to improve the learning environment of schools by renovation and refurbishment of girls school. It is expected that the project would have good impact

on girls' enrollment after its completion."

#### Sindh :

- Communities meeting were conducted for raising awareness of community members on the importance of education
- 30 schools have been selected by HANDS, for rehabilitations (10-schools from each district of Shikarpur, Kashmore and Jacobabad )
- SAFWCO completed assessment in 84 schools (27 government girls primary schools 57 government boys primary schools ).
- SAFWCO coordinating with local districts and tehsil education official to complete the final selection of schools for rehabilitation in flood affected areas of Sindh.



## Education Cluster Response to Displacement in KP/FATA

### Updates on displacement from Tirah Valley

As of June 12, 2013 some 9,689 families displaced from Para-chanmkani area of Kurram agency of Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) have been registered by UNHCR at New Durrani camp.

According to the UNHCR report of May 7, 2013, 17,140 families have been displaced from the Maidan area in the Tirah Valley of Khyber Agency, FATA, due to an escalation of hostilities between rival armed groups and the Government's security operations against armed non-state actors since mid-March 2013

Due to deteriorating security situation in Kurram Agency, the planned Multi-Cluster Rapid Assessment of Para-Chamkani IDPs has been delayed.

Currently, in total 41 camp schools/ NFE centres/ ALP centres/ ECE centres are functional in Jalozai, Togh Sarai and New Durrani IDP camps. Total enrolment in these schools is 10,623 children (5,055 girls and 5,668 boys).

UNICEF has provided school supplies to its implementing partners (IRC and Muslim Aid) working in Jalozai IDP camp for distribution in their camp schools/ ALPs and ECE centres.

IRC has received 5,000 student's learning kits, 1,500 school bags, 36 recreational kits, 36 first aid kits and 13 stretchers. Muslim Aid has received 4,590 student's learning kits, 1,800 school bags, 89 plastic mats, 90 sets of ALP text books, 8 recreational kits, 25 first aid kits

### **Off camps**

Save the Children continues to support 42 TLCs for IDP children living in host communities in Peshawar valley with total enrolment of 7,139 children (Girls: 3,268, Boys: 3,926) and 66 teachers (31 female and 35 male).

SC has registered displaced children from Tirah valley and enrolled 1,976 children in their off-camp TLCs in Peshawar district. 39 displaced children have also been enrolled in government schools of Kurram.

### **Education Response to Tirah valley displaced children and Challenges:**

So far, 1,643 Tirah displaced children have been enrolled in camp schools of Togh Sarai (100), New Durrani Camp (53), Temporary Learning Centres in Peshawar district (1,451) and Kurram Agency (39). Children enrolled in UNICEF supported camp schools are 153, Save the Children supported TLCs are 1,451, and Government schools of Kurram (39). School supplies including school tents, note books, stationery and other teaching and learning material have been provided to all 1,643 Tirah displaced children.

UNICEF, under CERF funding (USD 150,000), will support 2,500 Tirah displaced children in camp and off-camp in Kurram, Kohat, and Hangu.

### Emergency Education Response Activities in Camps/ Off camps of KP and FATA

#### **IDP Camps**

During the reporting period, with UNICEF support, eight Early Childhood Education (ECE) centres have been established in Jalozai camp with an enrolment of 236 students (Boys: 88; Girls: 148).
