

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SITUATION REPORT

NEW DURRANI IDPS CAMP KURRAM AGENCY



WHO EHA FATA team carried out assessment visit to new durrani IDPs camp established at village Sadda of lower Kurram for Internally Displaced People (IDPs) of Lower and upper Kurram Agencies.

Coordination meeting conducted with FDMA, SSD, CERD, Pak-Enterprises and Baran organization to discuss and scrutinize camp saturation and issues in services deliverance to the camp community.

There are total 4 phases, each one further divided into blocks; phase-1 (63 blocks), phase-2 (53 blocks), phase-3 (43 blocks) and phase-4 (11 blocks).

Details of WATSAN services and facilities at the camps are as follow.

WATER SUPPLY TO THE CAMP:

Main source to supply drinking and domestic water to the camp is a deep and protected bore well, Pak-Enterprises (UNICEF-IP) is responsible to supply water to the camp through tankers of approximate 5000 liters capacity.

Physical assessment of drinking water reveals water clear and fit for drinking according to WHO standards, chlorination to water tankers at main source was also in practice by Pak-Enterprises since start of the camp, which has been clogged these days due to unavailability of Chlorine HTH (65%) powder.

There are total 300 water storage tanks of capacity 500 Gallon each provided by SSD (UNICEF-IP) in scattered phases in the camp and 20 Lt jerry cans to each family were provided in NFIs kit by CERD (UNHCR-IP) for water collection, which is suitable for the current population in the camp according to emergency spheres.

Total 6 water samples were collected for bacteriological testing, 2 from the bore well and 4 from Households of scattered blocks in the camp, results reveal water safe for drinking purposes.

SANITATION:

SSD (UNICEF-IP) is responsible for WASH facilities in the camp; currently they have provided 1200 VIP latrines, 600 washrooms, 75 laundry and solid waste collection places, 300 washing pads for the current IDPs community.

Sanitary workers of SSD are regularly cleaning & washing WatSan facilities in the camp for communal use, hygiene promoters of the said organization are conducting regular sessions within the community for discouraging open defecation practices & encouraging inhabitants for proper use of toilets, advantages of maintaining a clean communal sewerage & empowering people for sustainable standard sanitation of the camp in order to reduce risks to human health and Environment.

About the HCWM, the health care workers were properly guided in an on job session conducted inside the camp, focused and a concentrated effort to overcome the threats related to HCW.
