

WHO Emergency Humanitarian Program Situation Report

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and FATA

Week 14

Date: April 01-07, 2012

1. Situation around IDP hosting districts

A: Situation in “Jalozai” IDP camp, Nowshera district

WHO shares situation updates on every alternate day and disease situation on daily basis of Jalozai IDP camp with health cluster partners on district, provincial and national levels.

WHO along with health cluster partners, UNICEF and provincial health authorities lead the emergency health response for the newly displaced IDPs in Jalozai camp and living in host communities in District Nowshera.

Till 7th April, 2012 a total of 132,672 families (542,395 individuals) as IDP population is living in KP and FATA, including 40,283 families (206,568 individuals) registered in Jalozai IDP camp. More IDP families opt to for off camp residence, 11,629 families are currently residing in the camp. In addition, out of 2,269 families (11,841 individuals) registered only 92 families (3,4%) decided to be accommodated in the camp.

WHO reports the disease trend for Acute Respiratory tract Infections (ARI) accounted for 25% or 782 cases of the total patients (3,099 consultations) in all age groups. Other Acute Diarrhea (OAD) accounted for 10% or 307 cases. Bloody Diarrhea (BD) shared 1.1% or 35 cases of all visits. Skin Infections (SCB) reported as 1.5% or 48 cases. A total of 2 measles alerts were reported and followed up by WHO.

A total of 3,099 consultations were reported through WHO supported DEWS (April 1-7, 2012) from 5 health posts in Jalozai camp. The most leading disease consultations include other diseases (1,898), upper respiratory tract infections (765), other acute diarrhea (307), scabies (48), etc. 1,096 consultations are registered via MERLIN run health posts and 2,003 – by CAMP NGO.

Health cluster meetings take place on every alternate basis in Jalozai Camp attended by partners from Health (Merlin, CAMP, CERD, UNICEF), WASH, Nutrition, Food and CCM clusters working in the camp where issues are discussed and decisions are taken on the spot to address any loop holes in the health response for containment and control of disease outbreaks in the camp.

Health cluster partners with support of WHO and UNICEF in the camp continue establishment of additional health posts in new phases of the camp to ensure provision of PHC; MCH; CMAM (SFP, SFP PLW, IYCF and OTP); pharmacy; immunization; community outreach & health awareness and referral services to IDP population.

WHO conducted the assessment of rational drug use by health cluster partners in the camp. 66% of patients (Merlin) have knowledge about the use of medicines (CAMP – 60%). Merlin health posts use 20% of antibiotics; CAMP – 50%. Merlin health posts use 30% of analgesics and CAMP – 90%. Merlin put in place 100% prescription as per WHO guidelines and CAMP – 80%. Merlin updates all of processed bin cards (100%) where CAMP – 80%.

WHO continues daily monitoring of rational use of medicines by all partners present in the camp. All additional requirements for essential medicines and other supplies by health cluster partners in the camp are being addressed and responded immediately by WHO. WHO supported health post by Merlin with 3000 Carbamazepine Tablet Oral 250 Mg, 1000 Paracetamol 60 ml syrup, 500 Syringe 5cc., 200 Gentian Violet solution, 115 meglumine Antimoiate inj, 1000 ORS, 80 clean delivery kits and one EHK package. WHO supported health post by CAMP with one EHK package, 192 Multi Vitamin Syrup, 240 ORS and 50 Nedex lotion.

WHO EH coordinator visited Jalozei IDP camp with EH team. The team visited the health facilities and WASH services in old and new phases of the camp. EH coordinator provided the suggestion for overall improvement of EH situation in the Camp. Meetings were held with WASH partners in the Camp and issues related to the community ownership of the Wash services and awareness was discussed. The team also inspected the newly installed by medical waste incinerator in Pabbi Satellite hospital Nowshera.

WHO tested 186 samples for residual chlorine, 160 samples were found within WHO guidelines values. Chlorine dose was adjusted for the remaining water samples for proper chlorination of the tankred water. 26 water samples were tested for microbiological contamination and 05 samples at household levels were found with minor contamination. In response community at house hold level were sensitized and proper hygiene sessions were conducted with the affected community. All the chlorinators are monitored for proper dose management at source and at users end.

WHO completed the HeRAMS (Health Resources Availability Mapping System) for all 58 health facilities in the district of Nowshera.

B. “Togh Sarai” IDP camp, Hangu district

Around 25 new families from shawo khel orakzai agency were registered by PDMA in Togh Sarai IDPs camp and currently approximately 1213 families inhabit in camp. Parada wall of sector D, E, A, G and H was completed along with parada wall of WASH facilities and the remaining is on progress in the camp. De-slugging of pits are in progress in sector H and I and D, E, G, H and A were completed. Camp chlorinator is delay and EHA team is waiting for PCRWR response. WASH facilities in the camp are satisfactory.

EHA-Team had a meeting with the Tehsil Municipal Officer (TMO) in Tehsil Municipal Authority (TMA) office in District Hangu date was decided for training to TMA staff with Provision of Wag-tech Machine, which is an important step in Capacity Building of the District Authorities. TMO, District Hangu has requested WHO for provision of Fogging machine for Vector control activities to be carried out in the District.

WHO DEWS report that acute respiratory infections are still the highest cause of morbidity (17.2% or 103 cases) of total of 598 consultations; other acute diarrhea (15.4% or 92 cases); skin infection (2.2% or 13 cases).

C. Situation in Tank district

MDM officials paid visit to Tank. MDM is expected to start their activities soon after the permission of government authorities. WHO conducted visit to 7 health facilities in order to verify the DEWS reports data and system generated alerts.

WHO held meeting with UNFPA staff while visiting their center. All the Gynae.&Obs. services in Ciivil Hospital Tank are provided by UNFPA. UNFPA Gomal(RHC) staff is still working in Civil Hospital Tank as district authorities advised them to stop activities at RHC Gomal because of security concerns.

WHO conducted training session with In Charge facilities BHU Shah Alam and SHC Darakki. Hand out were distributed which read the case definitions of major DEWS related diseases in Urdu language. Difference between various types of Diarrheas was explained and co morbidity was also educated

WHO conducted hygiene and health session with the school children and educated them for precautionary measures against hygiene related diseases, especially jaundice, typhoid and diarrhoea.

D. Situation in D I Khan district

30 health facilities reported to WHO via e DEWS. ARI remained major cause of morbidity. A total of 15 alerts of Measles reported and 01 Outbreak of Measles responded during week 14. Measles situation in district is getting alarming and in this regard WHO has taken the all stakeholder on board.

WHO supervises the construction work of Ware House in old premises of EDO Health office, to be completed in mid of April this year by SFD.

E. New Durrani” IDP camp, Kurram Agency

Local NGO “EHSAR Foundation” selected for provision of PHC services in the camp is still waiting for NOC they will be holding meeting with Provincial HEPR Cell to process their NOC request. Once they receive NOC they will immediately start their services in New Durrani IDP Camp.

F. Situation in Kohat district

District health authorities requested WHO assistance in the form of vehicles and POL provision for measles immunization campaign in 7-8 UCs. 12th April, 2012 has been decided the date for inauguration by DCO, Kohat of warehouse supported by WHO.

WHO in coordination with PPHI and EDO-H office has issued submission and compliance letter to all late and non reporting DEWS sites in District Kohat. A visit was made to ECHO funded work in DHQ and LMH Hospital, District Kohat and directed the responsible contractor to finish the work as soon possible.

34 out of 43 health facilities provide eDEWS.

eDEWS:

KPK DEWS:

3354 reports were received reporting 90,542 patient consultations in 13 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province and remaining district reports will share tomorrow morning. Acute respiratory infections are the highest cause of morbidity (23.5% or 21,313 cases) showing 0.3% decrease in percentage; acute diarrhoea (7% or 6,339 cases); skin infection (2.5% or 2,259 cases); suspected malaria (1% or 824 cases).

FATA DEWS:

54 reports were received reporting 15,482 patient consultations in 3 agencies of FATA. Acute respiratory infections are the highest cause of morbidity (18% or 2,731 cases) showing 1% decrease; acute diarrhoea (8% or 1,199 cases); skin infection (3% or 431 cases); suspected malaria (3% or 450 cases).

Alerts:

A total of 81 alerts including 8 measles outbreaks were received. 66 were suspected measles, 6 for NNT, 5 for leishmaniasis, 2 for AWD while 1 each Bloody Diarrhea and Pyrexia Unknown Origin.

District wise alerts bifurcation: 4 measles from Abbottabad, 2 AWD and 1 measles from Kohat, 3 Leishmaniasis and 4 measles including 1 outbreak for Lower Dir, 9 measles from Manshera, 1 leishmaniasis and 9 measles for Nowshera, 1 measles outbreak for Shangla, 3 measles alerts including 1 outbreak and 1 NNT from Swabi, 7 measles alerts from Swat, 5 NNT, 1 bloody diarrhoea, 2 measles alerts including 1 outbreak and 1 pyrexia unknown origin for Haripur, 1 measles and 1 leishmaniasis for Bajaur, 4 measles from Khyber while 1 each measles alert from Battagram, Charsadda, D.I Khan, Hangu and Lakki Marwat.

ARI Centers:

In week 14, a total of 1,042 consultations and one death were reported from 04 ARI centers. Functioning ARI

Centers are 2 in district Kohistan while 1 each in Lower Dir, and Abbottabad. Death reported was from ARI Center Abbottabad.

Hospital Coordinator:

Meeting held with CPO, Special Secretary Education and Director Education for ToTs of teachers on dengue awareness in KPK and proposed start date as 11th April 2012. Meeting conducted with DG FATA and RBM FATA and worked on IVM PC 1 along with WHO team from Islamabad. Routing support to HEPR for implementation of Dengue PC 1 provided. Meeting held with Secretary Health on nomination of one person for Leishmaniasis meeting in Cairo. Participation held in World Health Day in Women Medical College Abbottabad.

Essential Medicines:

- During week 14, 5 training sessions were conducted in Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Dir Lower and D.I. Khan. One day capacity building of DOH and The Johanniter's staff on rational use of medicines held at Peshawar in which 16 participants including MOs, 3 FMOs and 5 LHVs. During 3 days training on e-DEWS, WHO Pharmacist provided the training on RUM and STGs of Leishmaniasis. Total of 60 participants trained.
- Responded 6 Leishmaniasis cases at Bannu and Dir Lower by providing Meglumine Antimoniate Injections, 10 Measles cases at D.I. Khan and Dir lower while one neonatal Tetanus case responded at Bannu by providing Vitamin A and TIGs. 100 Meglumine Injections provided to PPHI, Mardan in response to Leishmaniasis cases.
- 12 types of assorted medicines delivered to PPHI Bannu and Dir Lower which are sufficient for approximately 6710 patients.
- Total 3 Monitoring and 3 follow up visits were performed this week including Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Mardan, Dir Lower and D.I. Khan. Gaps regarding irrational use, storage of essential medicines, record keeping and stock outs identified generally. Training and required Essential medicines provided as per need at visited health facilities.
- Total of 7 coordination meetings held with different stake holders including MS, DSM, ICMC and EDOHs in which availability of essential medicines, implementation of LSS, measles alerts and response, summer contingency plan and returning of essential medicines were discussed respectively. At swat coordination meetings were held with district coordination officer, revenue officer, EDOH, MS and DMS SGTH, PPHI, TMA, incharge National programme, principal DHDC and Saidu medical college, Students SMC and IPs and all the mentioned names were invited for the World health day.
- **IDPs camp Jalojai Activities:** All health facilities visited to ensure the smooth supply of essential medicines. 2 health cluster meetings attended this week to monitor health related issues and availability of essential medicines. 1 EHK to each Merlin and CAMP organization delivered for Jalojai Camp which is sufficient for 12000 populations. 16 types of assorted medicines delivered to Merlin which is sufficient for approx. 2481 patients while 2 types of assorted medicines provided to CAMP Organization which are sufficient for approx. 316 patients. 115 Meglumine Antimoniate Injection delivered to Merlin for 23 cases of Leishmaniasis also. Hands on training provided to Dispensers of two health facilities and FMO at Jalojai Camp on Record keeping, Patient counseling and rational use of medicines.
- **FATA:** Coordination meetings held with Agency surgeon, store keepers of AS warehouse khyber agency and FPHC Coordinator Mohmand agency in regards to measles alerts and their response, provision of PHC services to IDPs in Jalojai camp by Khyber agency staff, supply of essential medicines and benefits of LSS discussed respectively.
- Visits have been made to OPD pharmacies at RHC Ekkaghund Mohmand agency and CH Jamrud Khyber agency where stock registers, storage practices and rational use of medicines observed for essential medicines availability, limited shelf life item and its use, stock out trends and prescribing behavior.
- DHS FATA main warehouse visited to obtain various reports on LSS which led to the identification of limited shelf item stored at the warehouse. Thermal therapy machine for the treatment of Leishmaniasis

found and its user manual obtained to be used in Bajour agency.

- 300 Meglumine antimoniate provided to PPHI FATA for Leishmaniasis treatment at BHU Torkham Khyber agency.

WASH:

- WHO in collaboration with DoH Mehmmand agency celebrated “Mother and child health week” in Epi-week 14, 2012. National program (LHWs) arranged awareness walk in RHC Ekka Ghund, health staff of the HF, DHO, Tehsildar Lower Mohmand, WHO EHA team, FPHC and locals from the area participated in the activity.
- WHO received the list of targeted PHED sub branches in FATA and FR region KPK for provision of training and Wegtech kits for active water quality monitoring in the crisis affected people in the area.
- EDO-Health, WHO-EHA, MDM-F and RBM have jointly planned to conduct a walk campaign for the prevention and control of dengue/malaria epidemics in District Kohat. Religious leader and Mosque clerics will be mobilized to spread messages on prevention & control of water & vector born disease.
- 25 new families (From Shawo khel orakzai agency) were registered by PDMA in togh Saray IDPs camp and currently approximately 1213 families inhabit in camp.
- Parada wall construction of sector D, E, A, G and H was completed along with parada wall of WASH facilities and the remaining is on progress in the camp. This effort from camp WASH partners will help in optimizing the use of sanitation facilities by female and childrens.
- De-slugging of filled pit latrines are in progress in sector H and I and D, E, G, H in Togh saray camp where the same exercise completed for sector A.
- WHO EH team is following the issue of installation of auto-chlorinator on camp tube well source, PCRWR will install the chlorinators in next week.
- WHO EH team is monitoring the WASH services & facilities in Togh Saray camp Hangu, with overall camp EH and hygiene situation found satisfactory.
- Construction work of the WHO ware houses in FATA has been halted due to contractual issues with country office and so progress made so far to resume the pending work.
- 12th April, 2012 date is selected for “Inauguration of Kohat warehouse and District Coordination Officer (DCO Kohat) is elected as the chief guest of the events.
- WHO EH team in collaboration with local authorities in district Battagram organized and participated in the weekly cleanliness campaign held on 28th March 2012. Different NGO’s, line departs and INGO’s participated in this event.
- WHO in collaboration with DoH district swat organizing a seminar and walk on World Health Day 7th April, 2012.
- WHO EH team celebrated World Health day event in Saidu Medical College Swat also attended by WR WHO Pakistan Dr, Guido sabatenelli.
- EDO-H office, District Karak has requested for support in Vector Control Activities in District Karak.
- Coordination meeting was held with EDO Health, DCO Swat, EPI Coordinator, DPO Swat, and other partners regarding celebration of World Health Day on 7th 2012.
- EHA-team, District Kohat had a meeting with contractor responsible for civil work under ECHO fund and he informed the team that remaining work has almost been finished and soon he will call for final work check by the Team.
- Contractor responsible for civil work under SFD fund in LMH Hospital, District Kohat has not reported in the hospital after EHA-Team gave unsatisfactory work report to Federal office. The contractor has constantly been calling the EHA-team for release of some payments so he can complete the remaining work but team informed him that he should clear all payment related issues with Islamabad office.
- On March 27th, 2012, attended a meeting held at DCO office Battagram, regarding public awareness campaign on health, personal and community hygiene.
- EH Engineers WHO held a meeting with the WASH Partners and camp administration in Jalozaï camp district Nowshera regarding the issues related to rise in Bloody diarrhea cases in the camp. The team indicated the substandard food items being sold in the camp and requested to take administrative steps in this regard.

- It was also decided in the meeting that health facility will provide addresses of all diarrhea cases to the WASH partners for active follow up of the cases. WHO EH Engineer WHO Shared the disease situation update with WASH Partners in the camp and sensitize them on the rise of bloody diarrhea cases with recommendation to take appropriate action.
- Warehouse D.I.Khan work in progress and will be completed in month of April.
- WASH improvements works in City Hospital, Lucky Marwat, are almost complete but suspended due to some technical necessities.
- WHO team visits the DHQ Timargara, ARI Center Chakdara, THQ Chakdara, THQ Samarbagh and CD Koto for Alerts/outbreak response and routine health facilities monitoring.
- 15 measles alerts received during the Epi- week 14 in D.I.Khan. EHA D.I.Khan team responded 3 measles alerts in Zafarabad colony by educating the effected community.
- WHO EHA team responded two measles Alerts received from Village Ghurajshah, UC Khall, Tehsil Timargara, Village Gudar-shal kandai, UC & Tehsil Munda, Village kotkay, UC Rabat, Tehsil Balmbat , AR Taimar Camp, Timargara Dir lower. All the mentioned alerts were jointly responded by DoH & WHO EHA Team along EPI Vaccinators. Outreach Immunization activities were conducted in each affected areas with all available antigens. Vitamin A was given to all children. Village khidang chakisar has been visited on account of reported cases of suspected AWD. Water supply lines of drinking water were found leaked. Water samples from main source have been taken.
- EH Engineers followed the bloody diarrhea cases in the Jalozai camp Nowshera. WASH Partners and UNICEF WASH monitors were taken on board. The team collected addresses of all the cases reported from CAMP Organization health post and followed them in block F,J ,G and D in Phase 3.
- Sanitary inspection of water storage tanks and WASH Facilities was also carried out in these sectors in phase 3. Cleaning of the tanks found unhygienic was started on the spot.
- In routine water quality monitoring 8 samples was tested from different places. 02 number are found unfit for drinking.
- Recently 02 Wagtech kits were received for District Hangu, in which one Wagtech kit is new and one was used, have problem of battery and have no charger.
- EHA-Team had a meeting with the Tehsil Municipal Officer (TMO) in Tehsil Municipal Authority (TMA) office in District Hangu in Week 14. 11/04/2012 date was decided for training to TMA staff with Provision of Wag-tech Machine, which is an important step in Capacity Building of the District Authorities.
- TMO, District Hangu has requested EHA for provision of Fogging machine for Vector control activities to be carried out in the District.
- WHO shared Health journals based on water born diseases preventive & control measures, 50 sets of IEC materials based on water disinfection techniques, Personal, domestic and food hygiene, communal waste management, hand washing and preventive measures of diarrheal diseases on household level.
- WHO Team received AquaTabs (DG Health Stock) 71142 units AquaTabs and 67 mg (WHO Stock) 50000 units for Dir lower. 71142 unit Aquatabs, 67 mg (WHO Stock) 50000 Aquatabs and 720 soaps for Dir upper from Peshawar Warehouse.
- WHO provided 144 soaps, mop, sharp container, viper and 2600 aqua tabs to BHU central Jail for personnel hygiene and prevention of water born diseases in jail congested environment. WHO team will train their two staff on water safety and disinfection. WHO team will collect and test random water samples of jail from coming week.
- Field visits have been conducted to RHC Ekka Ghund, CHC Kassai, CHC Ghazi Kor, BHU Lakarro and BHU Muhabat Ghat Mohmand Agency. On job sessions conducted on prevention of diseases using proper management of health care waste management.

Nutrition:

- Due to the strikes of National Program staff in KPK, there has been no monthly meeting in the provincial office for the month of March. No reports of March received.
- Monitoring and evaluation of the Health and Nutrition Sentinel Site Surveillance System in Nowshera, in the sentinel sites of RHC Akora Khattak and RHC Akbar Pura.

- Four Days training held on facility based management of severe acute malnutrition in Shaheed Mian Rashid Hussain Hospital Pabbi, Nowshera. Approximately 10 participants including doctors and nurses were trained in the course.
- Meeting held with MS and Pediatrician Shaheed Mian Rashid Hussain Hospital Pabbi, Nowshera for the proper functioning and staff allocation for NSC. Full cooperation rendered.
- Coordination meeting held with Deputy Director Nutrition regarding the inaugural meeting of Provincial Thematic Working Group on nutrition. Details discussed and earliest possible calling of the meeting stressed.
- Meeting held with Health Secretary along with Deputy Director Nutrition for obtaining a date for the Provincial thematic Working Group on Nutrition. 14th April given for the inaugural meeting.
- Visit and monitoring held of health and nutrition stations in Jalozei camp with the HPP cluster members and Cluster Incharge. Monitored health & nutrition related activities in the stations of Merlin. They were informed about the functional stabilization center in Pabbi, Nowshera.
- Monitoring visits of Shaheed Mian Rashid Hussain Hospital Pabbi, Nowshera with the HPP cluster members and Cluster Incharge. Detailed meeting held with MS of the hospital was conducted.
- NUTRITION STABILIZATION CENTERS (KPK): Charsadda, Nowshera, Kohat, Mardan, Swabi, DI Khan, Lower Dir
- 25 patients of severe acute malnutrition with complications were admitted in the Nutrition Stabilization Centers of the province. 22 were cured, 2 defaulted and 14 patients are still under treatment.
- In Pabbi Hospital NSC in Nowshera, there were 3 cases of severe acute malnutrition already under treatment in the NSC. 2 new cases of SAM with complications were admitted in the week. 4 patients were cured and discharged and there was only one case of SAM with complications under treatment at the end of the week.
- Until now nutrition data of district Charsadda, DI Khan, Upper Dir, Lower Dir, Nowshera, Kohat, Swabi, Karak, Shangla, Swat and Mardan has been entered in database.

District level coordination & monitoring:

Shangla: WHO conducted visit to CD Shang, BHU Maira, BHU Kuzkana and CD Shahpur for eDEWS analysis. On 2nd April 2012 Health Sectoral working group meeting was held under the chair of EDOH. The meeting highlighted the upcoming NID's and support of IP's in the campaign. There was also discussion on the monsoon contingency and WHO-DEWS team analysis report on last year's AWD outbreak. It was directed to TMA and WATSAN to conduct a survey of high risk water sources and test them for E.coli. WHO-DEWS-EHE team insured their help in this regard. On 3rd April 2012 PPHI monthly review meeting was held at the District Secretariat. DEWS-Shangla team emphasized on the new eDEWS format by conducting a brief training during the meeting. DEWS team also trained the medical officers on proper alert reporting and response a step towards capacity building. On 5th April 2012 Dengue/ Vector control meeting was held under the chair of DCO. During the meeting SOP's for the upcoming insecticide spray in 8 high risk union councils was planned. The District administration directed DOH to follow the plans suggested by WHO-DEWS team in the last week technical meeting. PPHI also vowed to be actively involved in this and will provide human resource for this purpose.

Lower Dir: Coordination meetings held with EDOH, _EPI coordinator, Malaria Control program, National program, ACTED INTERNATIONAL, RELIEF INTERNATIONAL, ACF and MS DHQ Timargara for WASH, Vector control, measles alerts/outbreaks response.

Swabi: Coordination meeting held with the EDO-H and MS Bacha Khan Medical Complex regarding establishment of DHF isolation ward. Monitoring visit to TFC at BACHA Khan Medical complex held. 15 health facilities were visited to check DEWS reports and alerts.

Swat: Coordination meeting held with EDO Health, DCO Swat, EPI Coordinator, DPO Swat, and other partners regarding celebration of World Health Day on 7th 2012. Event was successfully celebrated with WR WHO in Saidu Medical College Swat also a walk and seminar was arranged for World Health Day.

Charsadda: BHU Umerzai, BHU Zarinabad, THQ Tangi, DHQ hospital and CD serdheri facilities were visited. Registers checked and on job orientation of the facility incharges regarding DEWS was done.

Haripur: WHO team visited Health facility: BHU STC4, BHU Amgah, BHU Nullah, RHC Halli, CH Kotla, CD KTS4, DHQ Haripur.

Khyber: During the Outbreak response outreach vaccination was done in which 659 children were vaccinated in the four affected areas collectively. Three system generated alerts responded to from Khyber Agency in Week 14, 2012, all these alerts were false alerts. Leishmaniasis surveillance failed in BHU Kam Shalman because the road was closed due to Curfew. Coordination Meetings with Agency Surgeon Khyber, FSMO, ADHO.
